Thriving Times

Never let it be said that the High Point Market fails to satisfy. This grand dame of U.S. furnishings markets continue to proclaim, "I'll be back." And come back she does, even in the face of challenges from other design events and the approaching Las Vegas show at the World Market Center in July 2005. When it comes to the high-end market, however, High Point shone brightly this fall, offering visitors a stunning array of creative, inspiring, and new pieces.

Faces in Front of the Furniture

Interesting stories came alive at High Point, including that of Councill, newly acquired by Hancock & Moore. Councill brought in designer John Black, formerly associated with Baker, to design Brownstone, a classic yet urban line. "These interpretations of period furniture look at period forms with a modern eye," says Carlton Mallory, president of Councill. The collection incorporates fluid designs and rich materials, with a new finish called Aubergine.

U.K. designer and fabric mogul Nina Campbell showed an array of new items through the Arthur Brett showroom. Campbell was on hand at the showroom to discuss the line, which is now entering its second year at High Point and in the U.S.
